# HOW CAN WE IMITATE THESE OLD TESTAMENT MEN IN OUR PRAYER?

#### **Be AWARE**

God is sovereign over all things and present in our darkest moments. Although we are limited humans, God grants the power of prayer to all believers.

### Be REAL

Lament is a form of worship—we can be honest with God about our pain. We can also cultivate a faith that is deeply rooted in God's ability to intervene on our behalf.

### **Be KINGDOM-MINDED**

Pray in alignment with God's will. We should view both our suffering and our requests within the framework of God's greater purposes in the world and beyond.

#### Be READY

Even in the reality of a broken world, we can develop a hope anchored in God's compassion and be expectant that he hears the prayers of his children.

## **APPLICATION**

Take some time to reflect on an area of your life where you are experiencing suffering or asking God to move. Write a prayer using the model below.

Express <b>AWARENESS</b> of God's sovereignty and his willingness to hear your prayer.	
Be <b>REAL</b> —honestly share what you are experiencing	
and tell God you believe he can act on your behalf.	
Pray that you would be <b>KINGDOM-MINDED</b> , and ask God to accomplish his purpose in your life.	
Ask God to make your heart <b>READY</b> to receive what	
he has for you, confident that he will move in compassion.
